

I have a dear friend who for an unknown reason was attacked by a coworker and severely beaten. Luckily some other workers saw what was happening and rescued him. It took some time for his physical wounds to heal. Unfortunately, the inner wounds are still bleeding. The person who attacked him died a few years ago and is buried in a nearby town. I, just a while back, asked him if he had ever forgiven his attacker. The answer shot back...NO!

I was shocked. The energy of his emotions jetting out of his mouth only dimly declared the fear, hate, and distrust he has for this dead man. He could not forgive...it was the only way he could win..or so I thought.

I suggested he drink a lot of coffee, drive to that man's grave and relieve himself. The answer was still NO! There was no way for him to gain closure. He was still being beaten. He had lost more than a few minutes dressed in pain, he has lost years of feeling safe.

And so it is, at some level for all of us. We hang onto hate to cover our guilt, fear, and shame.

I have heard hundreds of stories where people became holders of such events. Some from sexual or verbal abuse, and some of even worse violence than this. Only a few seem to have guts to walk to that lurking dark door off in the corner and open it to discover the light bathed countryside beyond, full of freedom and bounty. They are not ignorant of the door. Right over it is a sign written in blood, FORGIVENESS.

Over 40 years ago I met a man who himself had many reasons to sit



on his fear and hate, brooding over them like some prize leading to fame, yet he declared,

## 'hate and become like the one you hate. Love and instantly be like God.'

Since then I have watched to see if he was correct. Maybe not a hundred percent, but the odds are way in his favor. Then too, I have seen many movies where the writers know this statement to be expected, and sure enough, the one hating the one who hated them becomes an image of the same.
